GERMANY PIPS FRANCE IN TWO-WAY
SHOWDOWN AT SOPOT

FURUSIYYA FEI NATIONS CUP™ JUMPING 2015

Not for the first time in the history of the popular CSIO in Sopot, Poland, Team Germany came out on top at the fourth leg of the Furusiyya FEI Nations Cup™ Jumping 2015 Europe Division 2 League. However they had to work hard for their success, forced into a jump-off by the French who eventually had to settle for runner-up spot.

Belgium finished third, but it was the host team and Russia that scooped the maximum qualifying points towards the Furusiyya 2015 Final when sharing fourth spot ahead of Great Britain in sixth and Denmark in seventh, while last year's Sopot winners from Turkey had to settle for eighth place this time around.

With the maximum number of 13 nations lining out at this leg, the teams from Norway, Sweden, Ukraine, Austria and The Netherlands failed to make the cut into the second round when only eight teams returned.

SCOTT BRASH WINS SECOND MAJOR TO MAKE HISTORY IN AACHEN, GERMANY

History was made at the World Equestrian Festival Aachen in Germany when Scott Brash, riding Hello Sanctos, won the first equestrian Major of the year, the Rolex Grand Prix, and his second stage of the Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping.

Scott Brash is the first rider to achieve this remarkable feat since the introduction of the sport's ultimate challenge in 2013, and goes to the Spruce Meadows 'Masters' in September hoping to be the only rider in history to win all three Majors in succession.

Germany's Daniel Deusser riding Cornet d'Amour was second and France's Simon Delestre on Ryan des Hayettes was third. 🏆



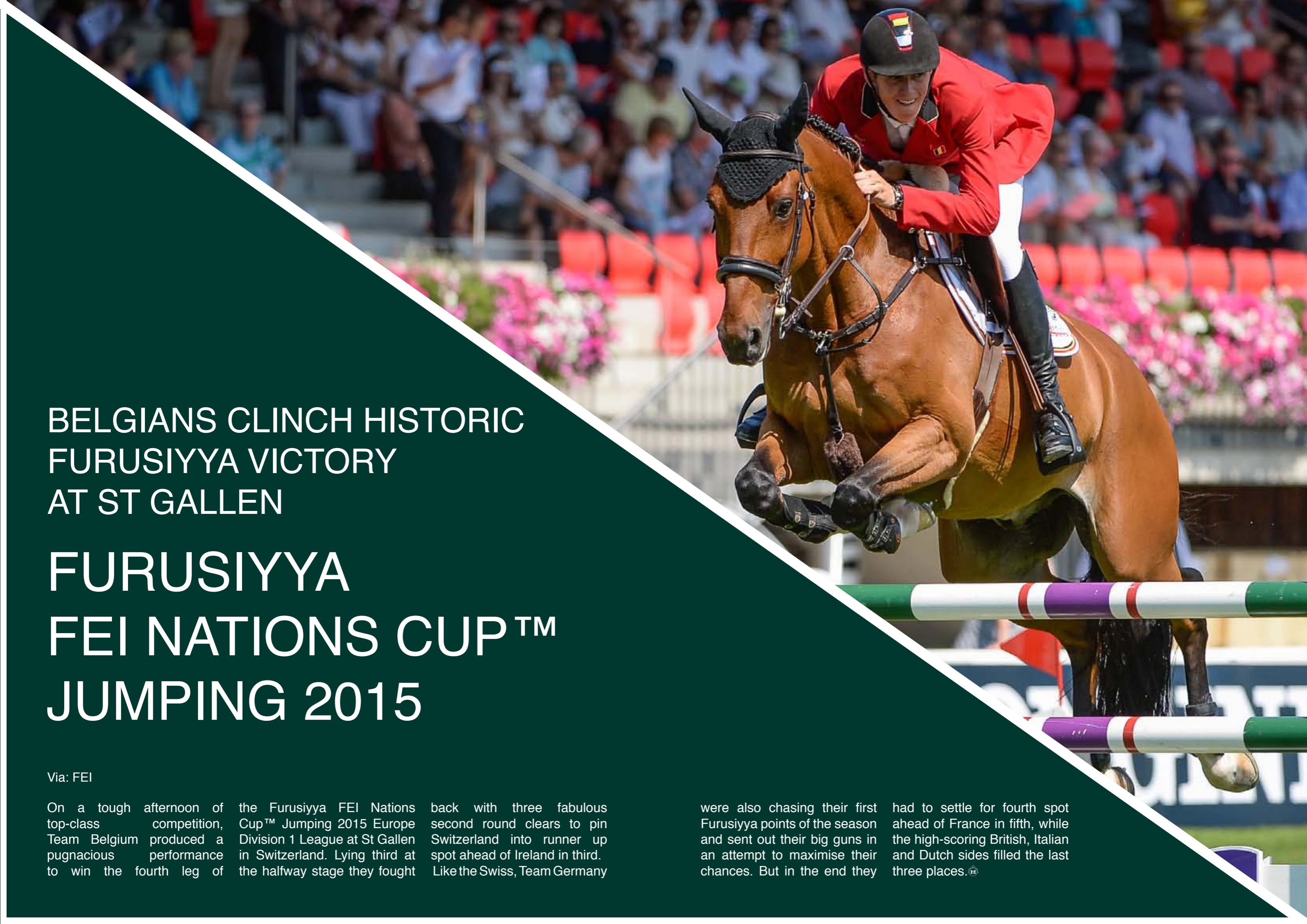

On a tough afternoon of top-class competition, Team Belgium produced a pugnacious performance to win the fourth leg of

the Furusiyya FEI Nations Cup™ Jumping 2015 Europe Division 1 League at St Gallen in Switzerland. Lying third at the halfway stage they fought

back with three fabulous second round clears to pin Switzerland into runner up spot ahead of Ireland in third. Like the Swiss, Team Germany

were also chasing their first Furusiyya points of the season and sent out their big guns in an attempt to maximise their chances. But in the end they

had to settle for fourth spot ahead of France in fifth, while the high-scoring British, Italian and Dutch sides filled the last three places.

French star Pénélope Leprevost thrilled the home crowd with a turbo-charged patriotic victory in the Longines Global Champions Tour Grand Prix of Cannes.

Pénélope's army of young fans were ecstatic as she powered across the finish line in an eye-popping 36.86, almost a full second ahead of Swedish champion Rolf-Göran Bengtsson on the extraordinary 16 year old stallion Casall Ask.

In the overall championship race Luciana Diniz has dramatically extended her lead in the ranking after finishing third on Fit for Fun. Luciana is now on 160 points, 50 points ahead of Pius Schwizer on 110 points and Scott Brash in 3rd place with 105 points. Rolf-Göran jumped up the ranking from 10th to 4th place and is on 99 points and Kent Farrington is 5th on 92 points.

The championship circuit next heads to Monte-Carlo, Monaco for Leg 7 as the series powers towards its halfway point. 🐾

And, to the delight of the home crowd, the Portuguese produced a much-improved second round to clinch runner-up spot and maximum points towards qualification for the Furusiyya 2015 Final.

The clock gave France the nod over Belgium for third place, while Team USA lined up fifth ahead of Ireland in sixth and Great Britain in seventh place.™

FEI Nations Cup™ Eventing 2015: Germany jumps into contention with first win in Britain

The German team made their first appearance in FEI Nations Cup™ Eventing 2015 a winning one when they arrived on British soil and captured the third leg in the beautiful and historic surroundings of Houghton Hall (GBR).

The home side, Great Britain, finished second out of the six teams and now heads the FEI Nations Cup™ Eventing leader board by just one point from France, who came third at Houghton Hall. Both nations have competed in all legs this season so far. The Netherlands took fourth place, ahead of Spain, fifth, and a three-man Australian team placed sixth.
